A Reflection on 30 Days of Generous Living

For 30 days in the month of June our community of faith, Mount Calvary Holy Church of Winston-Salem (MCHCWS), engaged in a month-long campaign of generosity we titled "JUNEROSITY". The purpose of JUNEROSITY was to challenge us to perform Random Acts of Generosity (RAGS) throughout the month to show and share the love of Christ with our fellow man.

When it started as a vision to increase the spirit of generosity within our church quickly spread and became a movement around our city and in various other parts of the country. Through the vehicle known as social media, the JUNEROSITY message spread like wildfire and pretty soon people with no connection to MCHCWS were performing their own RAGS and posting stories about them online.

One of my favorites was a pastor in another state who jumped on the JUNEROSITY train and showed his servant's heart by mowing both of his neighbors' lawns on either side of his house. This same pastor also cleaned up the work area of a coworker who had been taken to the hospital. I'm sure these seemingly small, random acts of generosity, made a huge impact in the lives of the recipients who learned that there are pastors and church leaders who do follow Jesus' model of coming to serve and not merely to be served.

Locally, I was blessed to see how many people in our congregation joined the JUNEROSITY journey and made a point of being intentionally generous for 30 days. There were those who reached out to businesses to secure in-kind donations of goods and services to be distributed throughout the community. Others flooded social media with the #JUNEROSITY hashtag detailing their own experiences throughout the month, and many showed up to our weekly JUNEROSITY events as we showed love to our community.

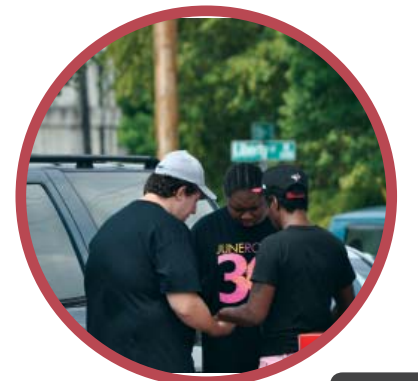
On June 14th volunteers from our church showed up at a local high school graduation with "Grad Bags" for every graduate. We blessed these burgeoning scholars with gifts and educational resources, a bottle of JUNEROSITY Water, and, of course, a balloon to congratulate them for their scholastic achievement. The looks on the



graduates' faces were priceless! Family members were so surprised that a local church would take time out to bless kids that did not even belong to their church.

Another JUNEROSITY event that had a major impact was our "Generosity Mobs". These were flash mobs of generosity that showed up at various places around the city to bless people. One mob showed up at a local barbershop and paid for everyone's haircut (including a generous tip for the barbers).

The barbers were so shocked that one of them stopped his haircut, pulled out his iPhone and started taking pictures! They were used to people coming into the barbershop to SELL something. This was the first they had seen people come in to GIVE something. (Cont. on 7)

We would all like to say Happy Father's Day.



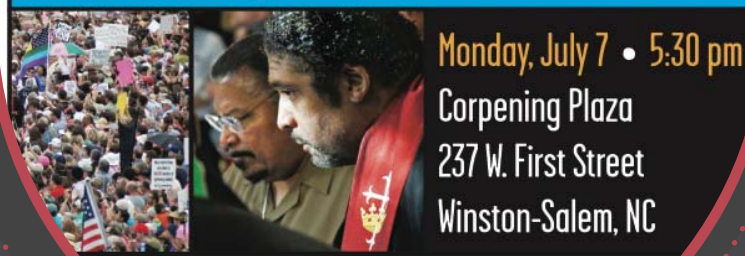

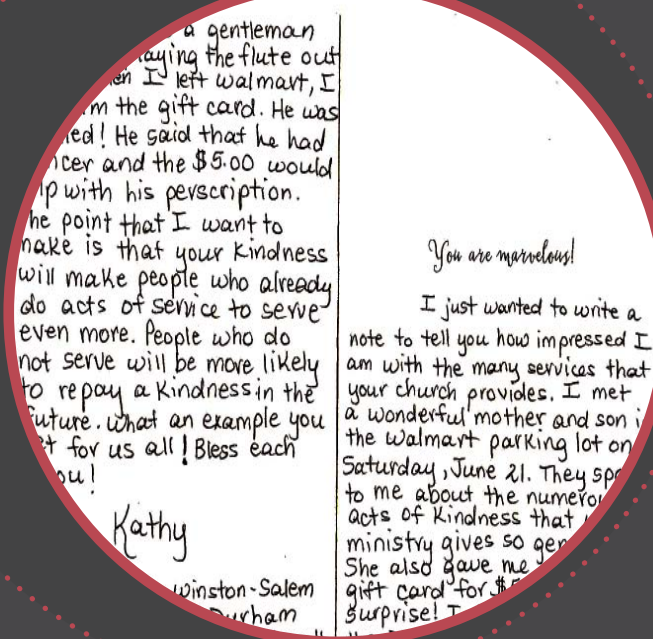

Reflections of Junerosity

Summer is the time for fun barbecues and delicious foods on the grill. But it's important the fire stays in the grill and no where else.

Here's a list of tips from the National Fire Protection Association to stay safe while grilling:

- *Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors.
- *The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- *Keep children and pets away from the grill area.
- *Never leave your grill unattended.

Charcoal grills

- *There are several ways to get the charcoal ready to use. Charcoal chimney starters allow you to start the charcoal using newspaper as a fuel.
- *If you use a starter fluid, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire.
- *Keep charcoal fluid out of the reach of children and away from heat sources.
- *When you are finished grilling, let the coals completely cool before disposing in a metal container.

Propane Grill

- *Check the gas tank hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year.
- *Apply a light soap and water solution to the hose. A propane leak will release bubbles.
- *If your grill has a gas leak, by smell or the soapy bubble test, and there is no flame, turn off the gas tank and grill. If the leak stops, get the grill serviced by a professional before using it again.
- *If the leak does not stop, call the fire department.
- *If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and call the fire department. Do not move the grill.

During the month of June, the MCHCWS church family engaged ourselves in 30 days of generous living and giving. The Random Act of Generosity ranged from opening the doors for others, leaving change in the vending machines, providing bus fare at the bus stop, giving tickets away at Laser Tag, and paying for strangers meals. Along with the Random Acts, the church family also participated in five (5) different generosity mobs. The generosity mobs touched people in several different ways.

As the Junerosity events were taking place, I was able to serve as the Volunteer Coordinator. The volunteers were able to come together and work as a team so several members of the Winston Salem communities could be blessed. I can truly say I was excited to interact with the individuals I called as well as see those who just showed up. The actions of each volunteer spoke volumes and were "heard" loudly throughout the city of Winston Salem, the state of North Carolina, and even in other states.

After each event, I took the time to reflect on how the generous acts not only blessed those who re-

ceived; but it also blessed those who were willing to give of their time, talents, and gifts. All I could do was cry after the Gallons of Grace/ Prayers at the Pump event. This event made me realize we shouldn't complain about anything because our situations could be worse. You never know what people are facing on a daily basis and how your generous act will help them through those tough times. I had to realize that it doesn't take much to lend a listening ear, offer up a prayer or provide some resources for those in need.

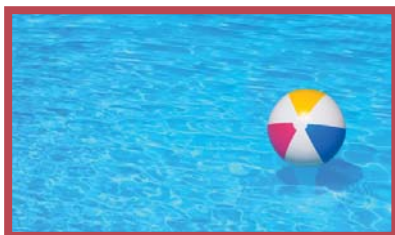

Pool Safety

As we enter into the summer months, we all know that they heat could be a little sweltering. This will make the young children and those young at heart find the nearest swimming pool to cool off. Well before you make your next trip to the pool, pay close attention to the pool safety tips:

- Make sure there is adequate supervision. If you're at a local pool, there should be a lifeguard on duty.
- Place a phone nearby the pool with emergency numbers (911, fire department, poison control center, etc.) listed. Signage about the pool, with "pool rules" is a good idea, but remembers to always instruct new users of your pool to what is allowed and what is not. Having a pool can make you popular with neighborhood friends of your children. If rules are not followed, do not allow these children to use the pool.
- Having rescue equipment on hand can help prevent a drowning person from drowning someone else. Ring buoys & reaching poles with life hooks should be at the ready. First aid kits should be near by also.
- Do not allow children to play near a pool. Games and bike riding can result in someone going in, perhaps bumping their head on the way.
- Learn CPR (Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation).
- Have your children take swimming lessons at an early age.

Other Generosity Mobs gathered at places like McDonald's, Wal-Mart, and a local laundromat to show love and generosity. They blessed people with free food, gift cards to help with groceries, and helped to wash, dry and fold clothes as acts of servant evangelism. We received numerous reports of people who were blessed by the experience - including from those who served on a Generosity Mob!

One thing we learned throughout this month is that generosity is its own reward. Money can't buy the feeling of joy one experiences when being intentionally generous to bless someone else. The Bible says, "The generous soul shall be made rich, and he who waters will also be watered himself" (Proverbs 11:25). It's hard to have a 'dry' life if you're constantly watering others. When we water others, water comes back to us. That's what I call 'The Generosity Cycle'.

Perhaps our biggest and most rewarding JUNEROSITY event of the month was our "Gallons of Grace" Gas Giveaway. For over an hour we took over a local gas station and gave FREE gas to persons in our community. The gas giveaway was scheduled to start at noon. Despite little to no advertisement, the parking lot was packed by 11:30 am. One lady told us that she had been waiting since 8:30 am!

All told, we blessed over 75 families with \$20 gas. Some people pulled up to the pump literally in tears saying that they did not know how they were going to make it home because they had no gas and no money. The event was so impacting that one of the local news stations came out and did a feature.

We closed the month by offering free haircuts at the church for men and boys who attended our final worship service of the month. What I loved most about this event was that it was not in our original plans. One of the ministers in our church was so inspired by the JUNEROSITY vision that she planned and organized the event and PAID for every haircut!

It just goes to show that generosity is contagious. I hope we all catch it! Let's keep the generosity going beyond JUNEROSITY. Generosity is more than a 30-day challenge...it's a 365-day choice. Choose to be generous today and every day.

Summer Pasta Salad



- 1 box of pasta (your choice, I chose the tri color rotini, also good with angel hair)
- 1 bottle of Italian Dressing (I love Hidden Valley Ranch)
- 1 cucumber (diced)
- 5-6 tomatoes (Roma, diced)
- 1 bell pepper (your choice of red, yellow or green...or all three) {remove seeds and dice}
- 1 small onion (I like red or yellow) {diced}
- green onions (chop all parts)
- Garlic Powder
- Salt & Pepper

1. Cook pasta according to directions, rinse with cool water and let cool
2. Once pasta cools, mix all ingredients in a bowl and add dressing
3. Cool in the fridge at least 3 hours (the longer it sits, the better the flavors marinade together)
4. Garlic Powder, salt & pepper are optional and are added according to your specific taste.
